Dear Parents, Students, and Well-wishers,

The Spark of Curiosity and the Spirit of Learning

As we celebrate this festive season, let us teach not only the rituals but also the reasons behind them. Curiosity is our children's brightest light—the same spark that inspires both a scientist in a lab and a child watching a diya flicker.

In a world powered by technology and AI, our ability to wonder remains uniquely human. To parents, I urge—encourage your child's questions and listen to their thoughts. You are shaping thinkers, not just students. And to our students—stay curious, ask fearlessly, and keep exploring.

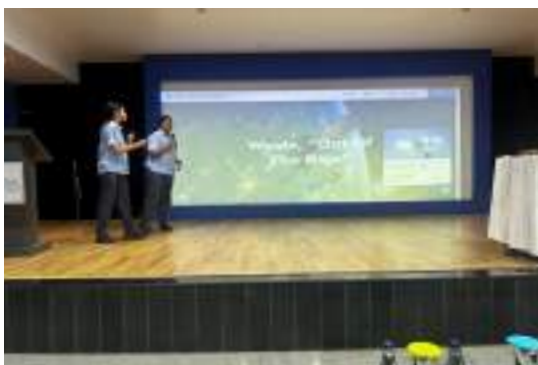
